

#### COVID-19: Fall 2022 Plans

Lamar Community College (LCC) is excited to be in-person and fully operational for the 2022-2023 academic year. The College will follow the guidelines provided by the Centers for Disease Control (CDC), the State of Colorado, and Prowers County Public Health. To ensure the safety, health, and well-being of the LCC Community, effective August 1, 2022 all members — Students, Faculty, and Staff —are strongly encouraged to be vaccinated against COVID-19 and to remain up to date in their vaccinations, including receiving a booster when eligible.

LCC respects the right for any individual to continue to wear a mask, regardless of vaccination status. In the spirit of care, we ask all members of the LCC community — including students, faculty, staff, and visitors — to act in a manner that demonstrates respect and consideration for those around them, including for the health and safety of all community members. Should someone ask you to wear a mask in their office or classroom or dorm room, please respect their request.

The College strongly encourages that all visitors to campus be vaccinated and boosted against the COVID-19 virus.

**Please Note:** LCC's procedures and protocols may be adjusted over time as guidance from local and federal authorities may change. Updates will be shared via email and on the LCC website.

#### **COVID-19 Vaccine Procedure**

Effective August 1, 2022 all members -- Students, Faculty, and Staff -- who are on campus are strongly encouraged to be vaccinated against COVID-19 and remain up to date in their vaccinations, including receiving a booster when eligible.

The College accepts all World Health Association (WHO) approved vaccines.

#### Submit a Vaccine Record

Students, staff, and faculty who choose to be vaccinated are asked to submit their vaccine record as soon as they complete their vaccine series and after they have received their booster dose(s). This information will remain private per all FERPA and HR policies and will not be shared with others.

- Employees Provide evidence of vaccine and/or booster to LCC Human Resources Department in the Trustees Building.
- Students Provide evidence of vaccine and/or booster to LCC Student Services
   Department in the Betz Technology Center.

#### If You Are Sick

For your safety and the safety of those around you, if you are sick please contact your healthcare provider for guidance and to determine if you should be tested for COVID-19. Please do not come to work or attend classes until you have been cleared to do so.

- Employees contact your healthcare provider to see if you need to be tested. Also contact your supervisor and work with them to determine if you need to take sick leave or if you are able to work remotely.
