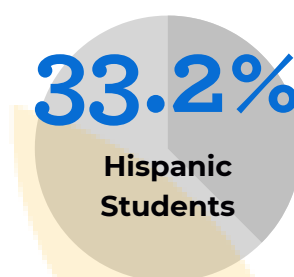
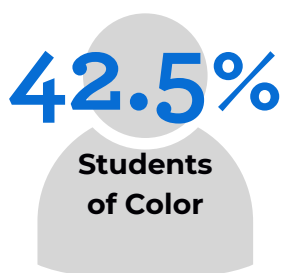
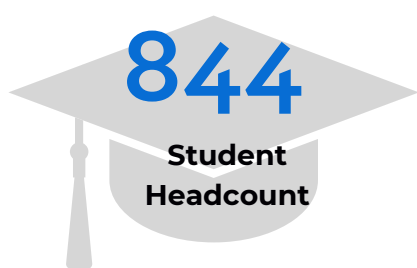

\$2.2M, 5-year grant (2018-2023)

\$1.5M, 2-year grant (2021-2023)

Response, Innovation, & Student Equity Education Fund
