Lamar Community College has 184 students enrolled in pre-collegiate COSI, a 12% increase from last year. The LCC COSI team has expanded its service sites to include Springfield, Walsh, and Las Animas high schools, effectively increasing our concurrent enrollment program by 50 students and the number of partner schools from 4 to 8.

Additionally, the LCC MSS Scholarship grant has been extended to 2024. So far, we have over 150 eligible students for this scholarship program. Furthermore, our "Back to Work" and "Finish What You Started" programs are also experiencing growth, with 8 and 10 additional students joining these initiatives, respectively.

New Employees


Welcome Jaelin Parker

Conversation Day: Strategic Planning – Action Priorities

Conversation Day is an annual gathering that unites all employees in a dynamic exchange of ideas and collaboration. Dr. Reyes and the college leadership team, together with the assistance of our HLC Accreditation Liaison Officer, Kelly Emick, and the President’s Leadership Council (PLC) lead this event. PLC members met in the summer of 2023 for the PLC Retreat to review institutional data, KPI, faculty communications, and student feedback in order to develop the LCC Strategic Plan 2020-2025 action priorities for Year 4 and Year 5. A consultant was hired, Derek Grubb, to help facilitate the planning process and align our strategic framework and priorities with institutional assessment data.

This year we are planning ahead and creating action priorities for both year four “cultivating growth and sustainability” and year five “service: being the college that serves”. Informed by a full data set, the President’s Leadership Council’s (PLC) and HLC Accreditation Liaison, Kelly Emick, worked with LCC leadership and Dr. Reyes and identified priorities for the next two years. PLC members then put together presentations to highlight the steps of their priorities and tactics, explaining how data led them to these Strategic Planning Initiatives, implementation timelines and expected outcomes. As an Academic Quality Improvement Project (AQIP) campus, each employee at the College participated in or gave valuable feedback to each action priority. The Strategic Plan below is a summary of the action priorities identified by data and feedback, not included are the tactics and timelines.

LCC Strategic Plan – Academic Year 4 and 5

Action Priority Projects

1. Student Success Priority

- 1.1. Decrease student time to enrollment to less than 1 week during the registration timeframe.
- 1.2. Create a process and fail-over map for the flow in student services and identify cross-training needs.
- 1.3. Provide more inclusive student life activities.

2. Employee Success Priority

- 2.1. Work with employees to evaluate job descriptions and ensure efficient yet effective employee roles.
- 2.2. Enhance onboarding of new and existing employees.
- 2.3. Market positions and promote retention with work/life balance to meet LCC needs.
- 2.4. Create a space for employees to build a sense of community among the staff.

3. Resource Success Priority

- 3.1. Establish a budget process that evaluates enrollment potential and leads to strategic investments.
- 3.2. Invest in a program plan for the Trustees building.
- 3.3. Invest in campus housing to maintain and grow on-campus enrollment.

4. Community Success Priority

- 4.1. Continue a dynamic relationship with our community to maintain a positive perception.
- 4.2. Develop a work-based learning program that connects local industry to LCC and potential students.
- 4.3. Facilitate regular engagements with community donors and potential donors of LCC.

In addition to college-wide projects each department and unit have its own action priorities and projects related to cultivating growth, sustainability, and service.

Career Advance Colorado

Thanks to Career Advance Colorado, qualifying students who enroll in select Construction Trades, Nursing, Welding, and Education programs will have their fees covered while funding is available. Starting in August 2023, students who enroll in these select programs will have their tuition, fees, course materials, and other costs provided for by this grant. LCC has identified 62 potential students for this grant, has awarded 40 currently attending students with a grand total of \$94,210. We expect to award additional students as the requirements of qualifications are satisfied.

Fall Student Enrollment

With the advent of a new academic year and the changing foliage, Lamar Community College is witnessing a promising trend - a surge in student enrollment.

As of September 28, the institution has observed a notable upswing in enrollment, with a fall enrollment yield increase from 24% to 45%, a 5.4% increase in Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) students, totaling 260 FTEs, and a 7% rise in headcount compared to the previous fall, reaching a total of 722 students.

- Continuing Student Population: This segment has shown a remarkable 9.3% increase, underscoring the sustained success of LCC's existing students.
- Concurrent Enrollment Students: The surge in concurrent enrollment, with a 13% increase, highlights the attractiveness of LCC's educational offerings to high school students and our strong partnerships with local high schools.
- New First-Time Students: LCC has welcomed a 6% increase in new first-time students, demonstrating its ability to attract and enroll college freshmen and nurture their educational journeys.
- Readmit Students: The return of readmit students has been exceptional, with an impressive 18% growth, a testament to our commitment to helping students complete their degrees and enhance their personal and career success.

These accomplishments are a testament to the unwavering dedication and hard work of Lamar Community College's esteemed faculty, staff, and students. Together, they remain steadfast in their mission to "Enrich Lives Through Learning," continuously expanding access and supporting students' success, shaping a bright future for the College and the vibrant communities in Southeast Colorado.

At LCC, the unyielding belief in the importance of accessible education for all is at the core of our mission. This commitment is exemplified through numerous initiatives, including a comprehensive range of scholarships and financial aid support, quality athletic programs, individualized student support services, and an extensive array of technical and transfer degree programs.

IREPO Update

The IREPO Grant has been instrumental in enhancing LCC's teaching and learning experience by incorporating state-of-the-art technology to foster a more engaging, active learning environment. We transformed 22 classrooms with the addition of 2-4 85" flat screens each and new projectors, enabling seamless connectivity for instructors and students. Our lecture halls have been upgraded with 3x3ft and 4x4ft display arrays. In addition, we have implemented a Microsoft Surface checkout program through our library, enabling students without personal laptops to borrow a Surface for the entire semester at no cost. Complementing this, we offered a Wi-Fi/hotspot checkout service for students and athletes who may experience connectivity issues at home or while traveling. Our commitment to education extends beyond LCC, as we have equipped 15 local high schools with flat screens on mobile carts to support concurrent enrollment learners.

Mascot Reveal Event – sponsored by TA, Lamar, Colorado

Lamar Community College is hosting a mascot reveal event on November 1st, 2023, at the season's first Runnin' Lopes basketball games. This event is possible due to the extremely generous sponsorship donation of \$10,000 from TA, Lamar, Colorado site. The winning name from the naming contest will be announced, and we will be giving out concession vouchers for the first 100 people in the door, swag, and t-shirts throughout the event. LCC will also be holding a special tribute to the previous mascot that proudly served the Runnin' Lopes in the days of his prime. New LCC Website Launched
