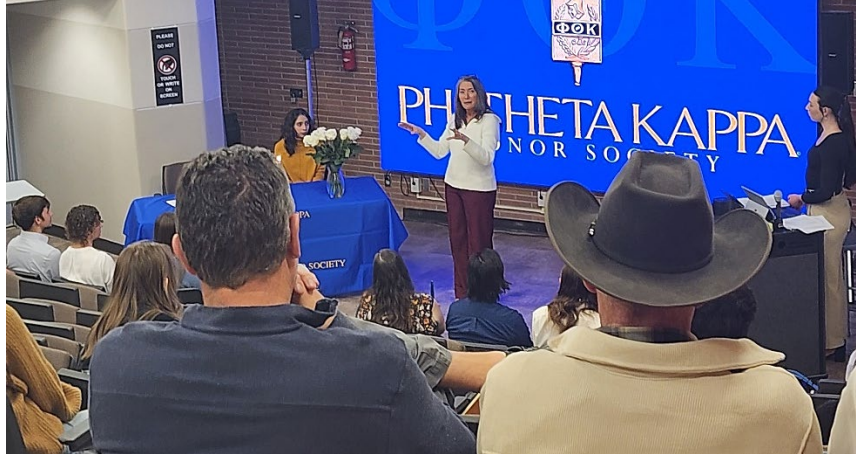
LCC Celebrates Excellence at Phi Theta Kappa Induction Ceremony

Celebrating Success at LCC's Fall Horse Show

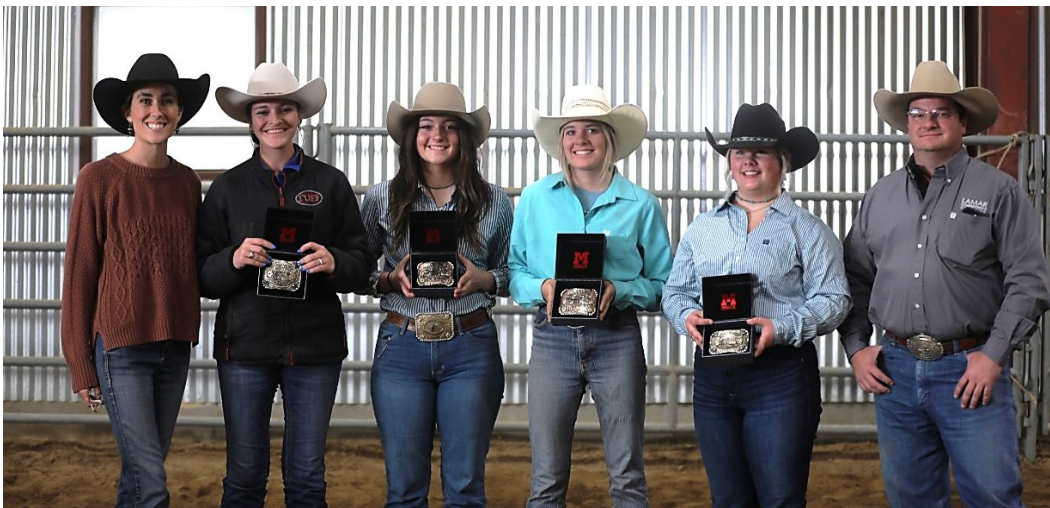

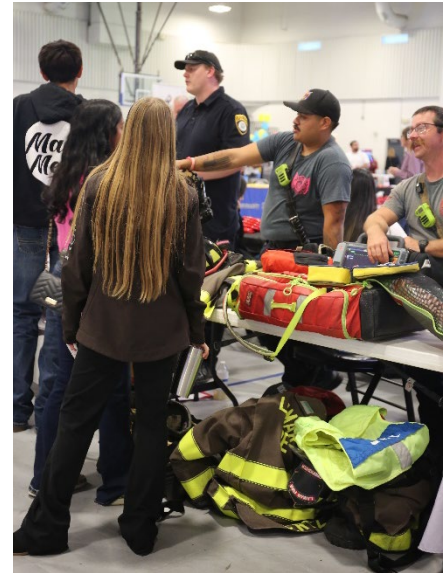


LCC Hosts Successful Career Fair Connecting Students and Employers
