


Lamar Community College Hosts Annual Ag Olympics, Celebrating Student Skill and Community Spirit

Starting Fall 2025, Lamar Community College (LCC) is offering the new COSI/ASAP program for Colorado residents who are full-time students pursuing an associate degree. This initiative provides strong academic, financial, and personal support to help students graduate in less than three years. Funded by Arnold Ventures and led by the Colorado Opportunity Scholarship Initiative (COSI), the program brings the nationally recognized ASAP model to Colorado for the first time.

Students accepted into the program will receive tuition gap coverage after all other financial aid is applied, a \$250 book stipend each semester, and a \$200 monthly cash incentive for up to four months per semester if they meet engagement requirements. They'll also benefit from personalized, one-on-one advising for academic, career, and personal development.

To qualify, applicants must be Colorado residents or meet ASSET eligibility, complete the FAFSA or CAFSA, enroll full-time (at least 24 credit hours per academic year), and have no more than 24 completed college credits at the time of application (credits earned in high school don't count). Participants must also commit to regular meetings with their ASAP advisor and actively engage in program activities.
