

CAMPUS HAZING TRANSPARENCY REPORT



The Federal Stop Campus Hazing Act was created in 2025. A component of the act is the reporting of any documented violation of hazing by a student organization.

The Act defines hazing as:

- any intentional, knowing, or reckless act committed by a person (whether individually or in concert with other persons) against another person or persons, regardless of the willingness of such other person or persons to participate, that –
- is committed in the course of an initiation into, an affiliation with, or the maintenance of membership in, a student organization; and
- causes or creates a risk, above the reasonable risk encountered in the course of participation in the institution of higher education or the organization (such as the physical preparation necessary for participation in an athletic team), of physical or psychological injury. The Act defines a student organization as: an organization at an institution of higher education (such as a club, society, association, varsity or junior varsity athletic team, club sports team, fraternity, sorority, band, or student government) in which two or more of the members are students enrolled at the institution of higher education, whether or not the organization is established or recognized by the institution.

Lamar Community College will share information on its website about hazing violations by any established or recognized student organization in a report called the Campus Hazing Transparency Report. This report will be updated two times per year, and will include:

- A description of what happened, including if alcohol or drugs were used in an illegal or harmful way.
- What the university found during its investigation.
- Any sanctions the student group received from the university.
- The date when the hazing was said to have happened.
- The date when the university started investigating the incident.
- The date when the university finished the investigation and decided that hazing did occur.
- The date when the university told the student group that they were found responsible for hazing.

Any hazing violations will be documented below, and this report will be updated every six months.

July 1, 2025 to December 10, 2025 – No reported violations

December 11, 2025 to June 10, 2026 – No reported violations
